Some services will be delivered in a push in model while other services may be delivered in a pull out model.
- Provide consultation occupational therapy services to special education students with the
 frequency and duration determined in the IEP, including following up after a change in
 programming has been made for a student. This may include conferring with the general
 education teacher and/or support staff to address the educational needs of the student as it
